





Background

- High proportion migrants of reproductive age in Oslo
- Inequity in pregnancy outcomes
- Migration as risk marker for substandard care
- Inadequate knowledge of migrant women's perception of care





Overall aims

Improve pregnancy outcomes among recent migrants by:

- Identification of health-care related factors that contribute to inequity in pregnancy outcomes
- Complex intervention to address these factors





Primary outcomes

Improve pregnancy outcomes among recent migrants by:

- Identification of health-care related factors that contribute to inequity in pregnancy outcomes
- Complex intervention to address these factors





Inclusion

- International migrant women 15-49 years
- Maternal country of birth outside the OECD
- <5 years of stay in Norway



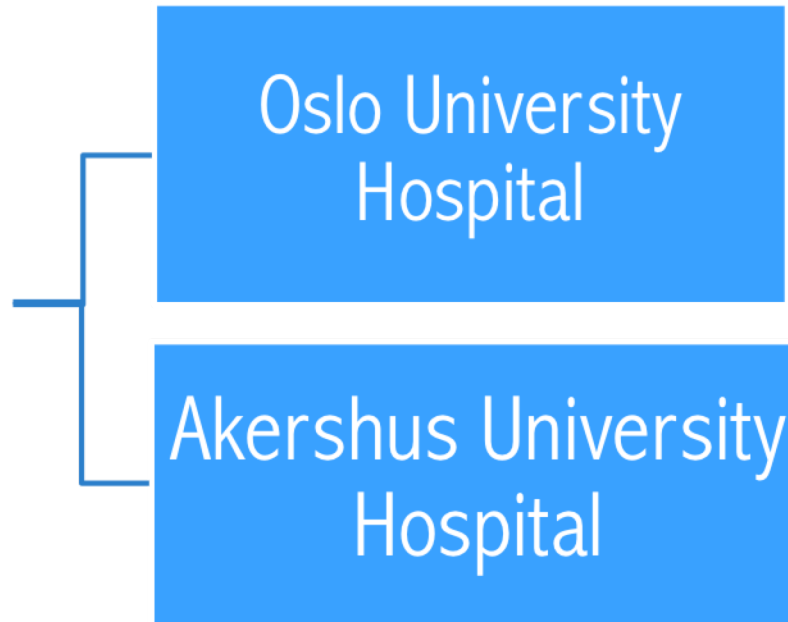

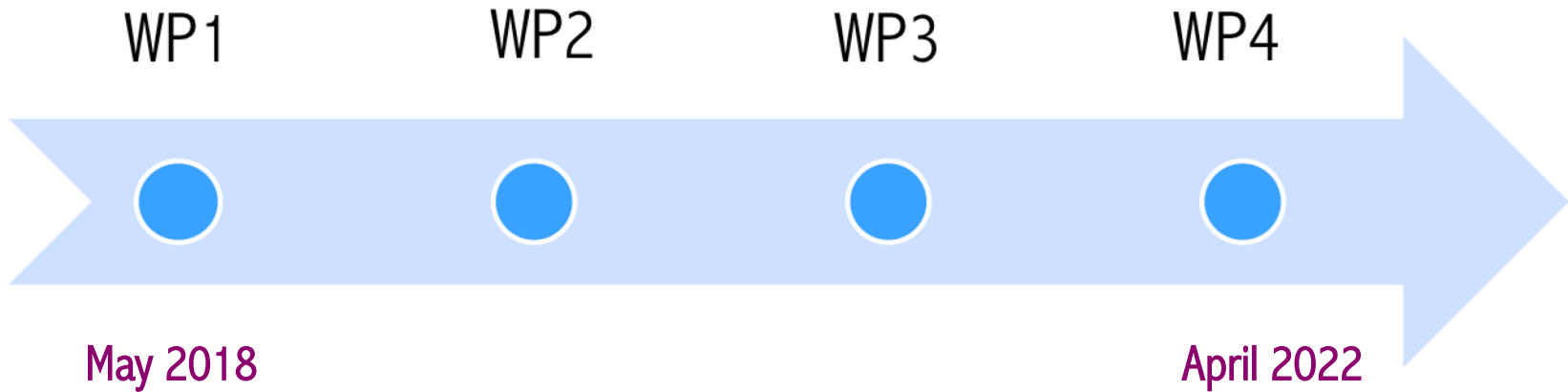

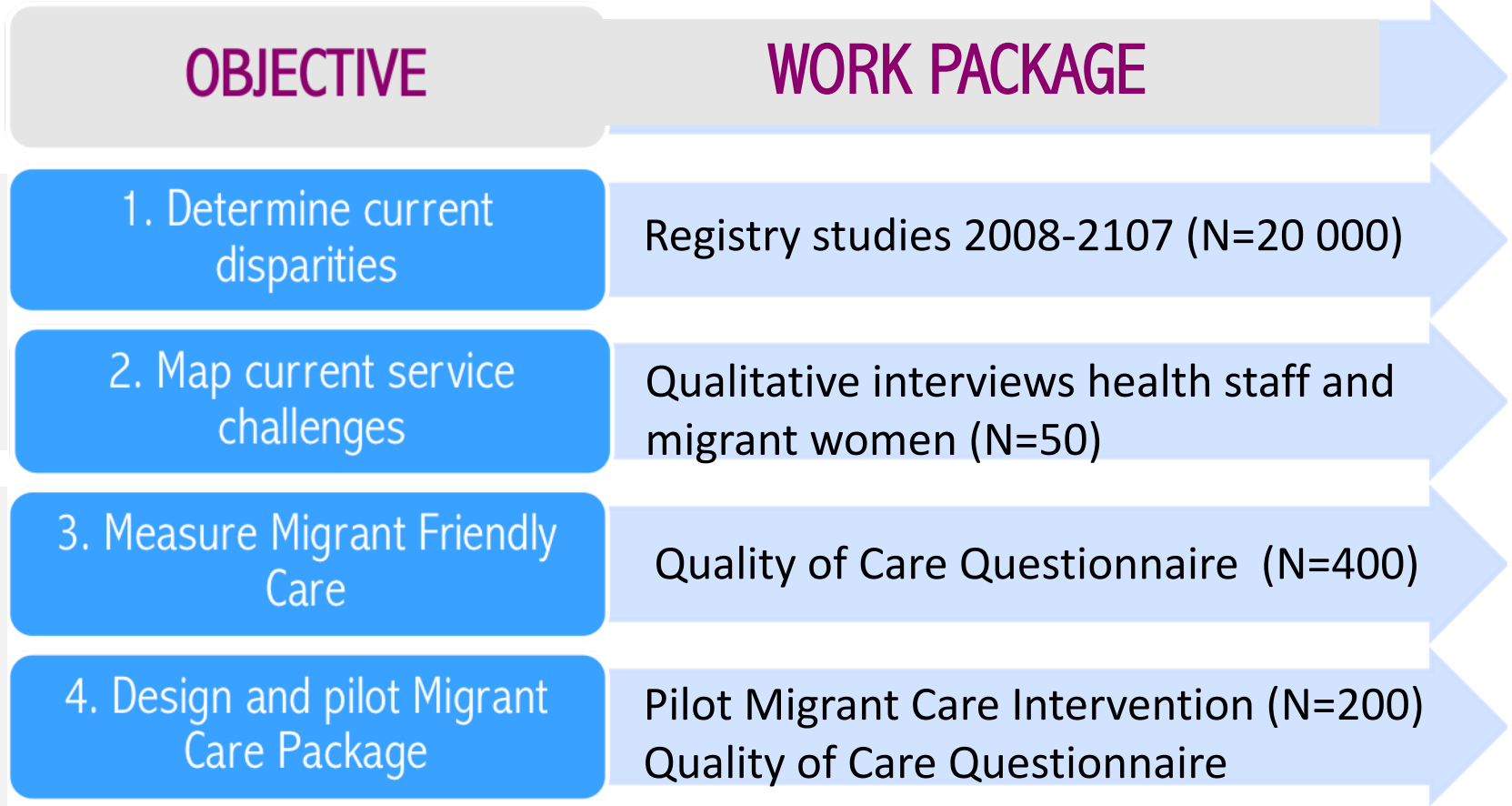

Expanded time 1st consultation

Full coverage professional interpreter
