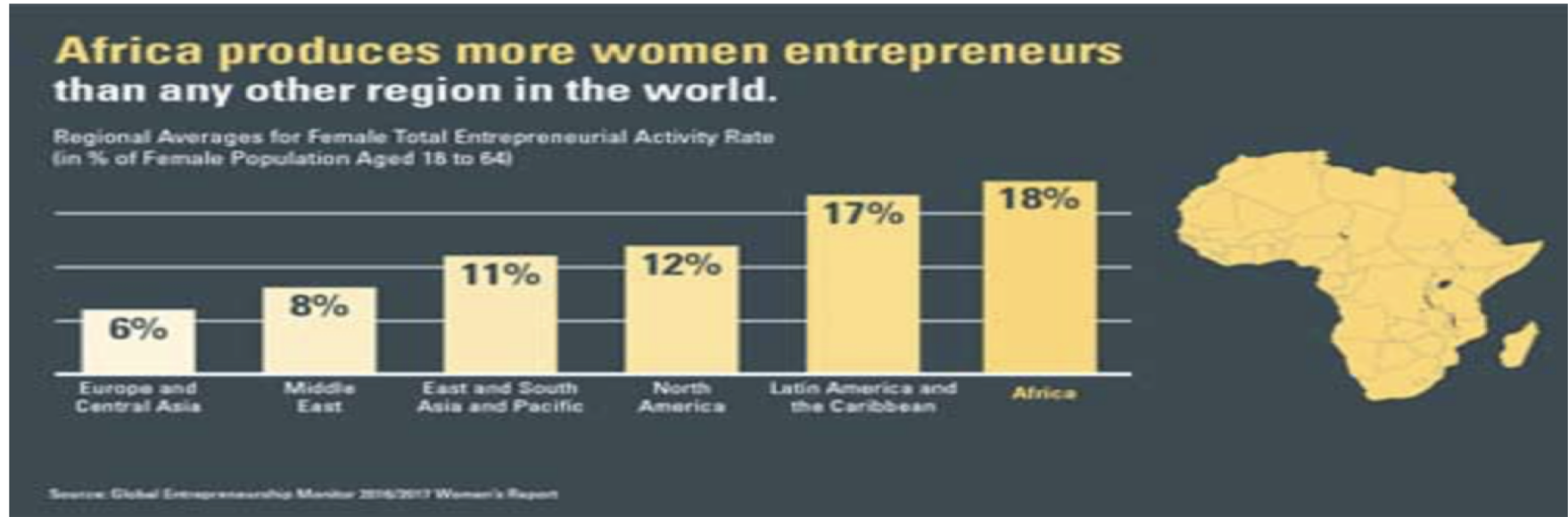


Why women ?

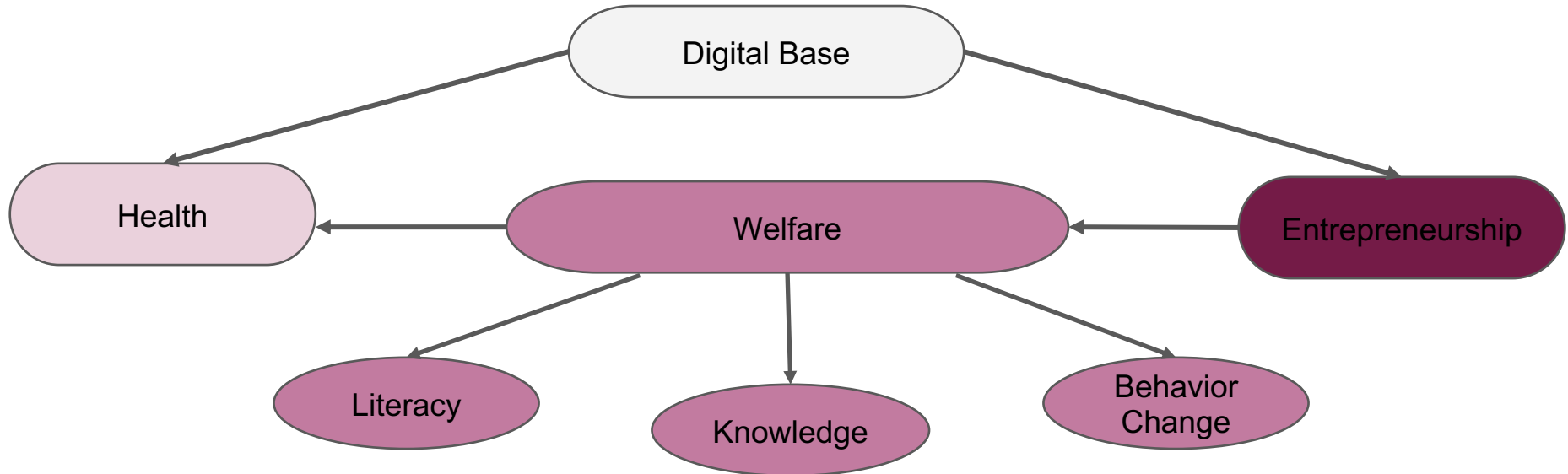

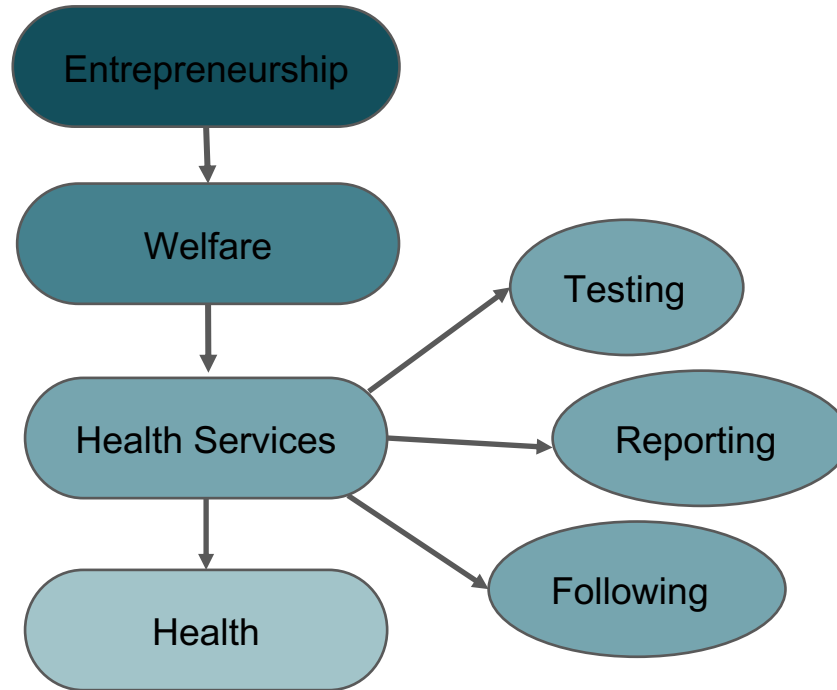

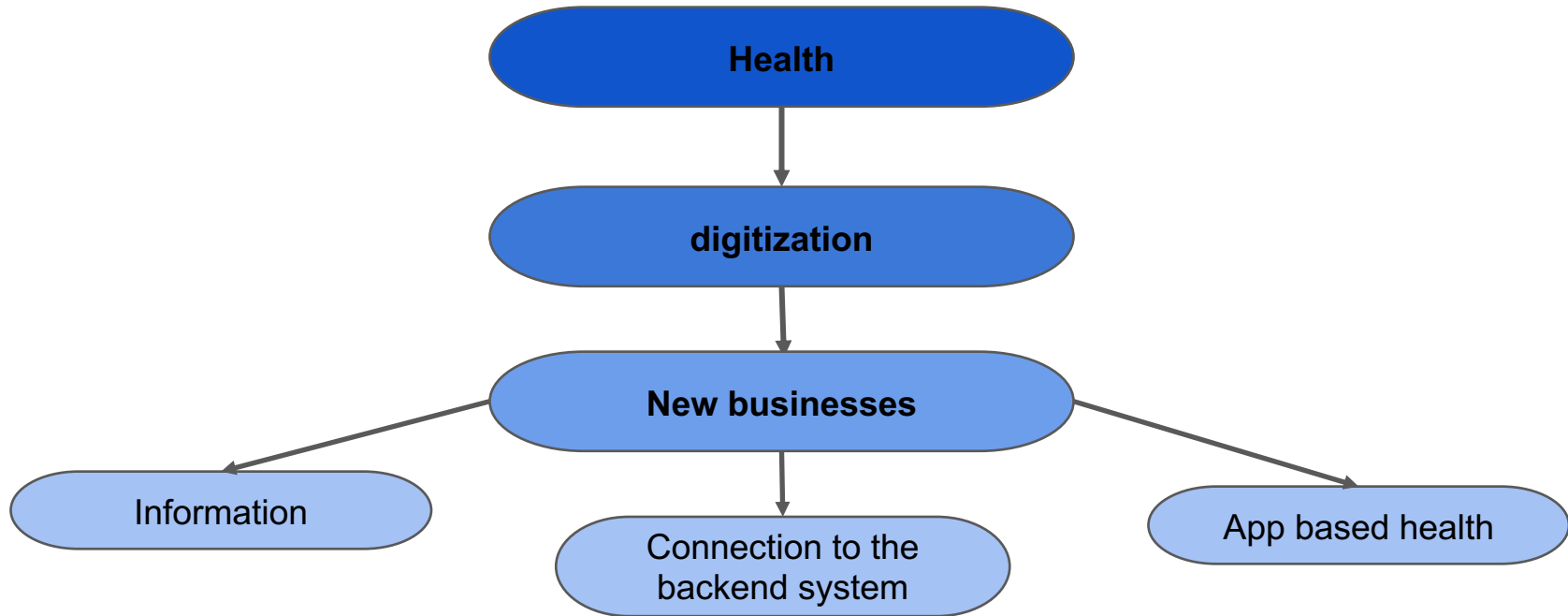
