

Student mobility?


Objectives of EXCEL SMART JUIO NORPART:

- 1. Increase quality and internationalization of the new PhD program at JU CHS through student & staff exchange with the Faculty of Medicine at UiO.
- 2. Increase the quality and internationalization in three academic areas (Health Economic Evaluation, Health Professionals Education and Biostatistics) by mobility, strategic mentoring and academic partnerships by accepting qualified JU staff and students in the UiO PhD and MPhil programs.
- 3. Increase opportunities for student mobility for UiO students from different fields to JU including the JU hospital.


EXCEL SMART in short

- 5 or 13 weeks visit to Jimma
- Courses at JU, internship/volunteer work or data collection/research
- Supervisors from Jimma and UiO
- Stipends and travel + visa costs covered by EXCEL SMART and Lånekassen
- Not a regular student exchange program at UiO
- A collaboration program nested within the Centre for Global Health at the UiO.

What to do in Jimma?

Classes	Courses at Jimma University, either as summer courses or in combination with other activities.
Research	Students can contribute to a specific research project or do their own research (e.g. data collection for Ph.D./Master's thesis). Master students will get support from a mentor at JU and UiO.
Volunteer work	Students can volunteer at the Jimma University Hospital, a local NGO or Jimma City Health Department.

Courses

There are two elective courses for credit transfer to UiO (5 ECTS):

- Advanced Biostatistics
- Advanced Epidemiology

Each course has flexible start-up date and lasts approx. 4 weeks
