Professor Frances S Mair

Frances Mair is professor of Primary Care Research (General Practice and Primary Care), University of Glasgow. She is presently in lead of the western part of the Scottish Primary Care Research Network. She entered academic general practice at the University of Liverpool where she became Professor of Primary Care Research and Director of the Mersey Primary Care R&D Consortium. While in Liverpool she had a one year research fellowship in Telemedicine/Family Medicine at the University of Kansas Medical Centre, USA. She commenced at the University of Glasgow in 2005 and was appointed Head of General Practice and Primary Care in 2009. She is currently a visiting Professor at the Universities of Liverpool and Southampton. She is a member of the MRC Clinical Research Training Fellowship panel. Mair is former President of the Royal Society of Medicine, London, Telemedicine and E-Health Section and Associate Editor Journal of Telemedicine and Telecare. She was awarded the Society of Academic Primary Care and North American Primary Care Research Group Senior Investigator Award 2016.

Professor Frank Sullivan

Frank Sullivan has been an academic GP since joining a practice in Blantyre, Lanarkshire in 1984. During his early years in practice he undertook a PhD in Glasgow University and a sabbatical year to work as a GP in the Seychelles. He left to take up the NHS Tayside chair of General Practice and Primary Care in the University of Dundee in 1998. He was appointed as the Director of the Scottish School of Primary Care in 2007.

His research interests lie mainly in health informatics and community based trials, covering the spectrum from record-linkage of electronic health records to decision support to the evaluation of complex interventions.

He has published widely on a number of different types of primary care research notably in the management of long-term conditions such as diabetes and coronary heart disease in the community. He has published 200 journal articles including the BMA research paper of the year in 2009 for a New England Journal of Medicine Paper on the early management of Bell's Palsy. He was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Edinburgh 2011. Frank has also been working as a professor and research director in Toronto, Canada, for some years. Here he was responsible for establishing the "UTOPIAN" practice based research network at the University of Toronto.

Professor Guri Rørtveit

Guri Rørtveit er professor i allmennmedisin og instituttleder ved Institutt for global helse og samfunnsmedisin ved Universitetet i Bergen. Hun var forskningsleder ved allmennmedisinsk forskningsenhet i Bergen 2006-2015 der hun fortsatt har en bistilling. Hun har dessuten arbeidet i primærhelsetjenesten 1993-2015 som kommunelege, bydelslege, fastlege og legevakslege. Hun tok sin doktorgrad i 2004 med registerbaserte studier om svangerskap og fødsel og risiko for inkontinens. Siden har hun utviklet flere forskningsprosjekter knyttet til infeksjonsmedisinske problemstillinger i allmennpraksis; giardia-infeksjon med seinfølger, gastroenteritter mer generelt, impetigo (brennkopper) og influensa. Guri Rørtveit har arbeidet i flere år for å utvikle en infrastruktur for klinisk forskning i primærhelsetjenesten (praksisbasert forskningsnettverk). Hun har engasjert seg i fagpolitiske prosesser og debatter knyttet til Samhandlingsreformen, HelseOmsorg21-strategien og Primærhelsetjenestemeldingen.

Spesialrådgiver Kjell Røynesdal

Spesialrådgiver, tidligere avdelingsdirektør, i Helse og Omsorgsdepartementet. Har tidligere praksiserfaring som tannlege.

Professor Tiril Wilumsen

Tiril Wilumsen er professor ved Avdeling for pedodonti og atferdsfag, Institutt for klinisk odontologi, Det odontologiske fakultet, Universitetet i Oslo. Wilumsen er blant annet involvert i TOO-prosjektet (tortur-, overgrep- og odontofobiprojektet) både gjennom arbeid med nasjonal kompetanseoppbygging og på Tannhelsetjenestens Kompetansesenter Øst. Hun fikk Akademikerprisen for 2014 for sin forskning på tannlegeskrekk i forbindelse med tortur og overgrep. Hun var prosjektleder for pilotstudien for allmenntannnettverket.
