We had applied for an extension of our project as stated in our annual report for 2021. The annual report with all the requested changes including the no-cost extension to 2024 was approved as confirmed by Hilde Kjøsttvedt through her mail on 22th of June, 2021.

2.1 Project summary and results

Project summary and results

Project summary (from the project document)

Department of Psychiatry and Mental Health, Institute of Medicine (IOM), Tribhuvan University (TU) and Department of Adult Psychiatry, Institute of Clinical Medicine, University of Oslo (UiO) are together applying for a project to collaborate in education and research in mental health which will enhance the quality of higher education in Norway and Nepal. IOM, TU is supported by Kanti Children Hospital, Child Workers In Nepal, For Utvikling (FORUT) while UiO is supported by University of Bergen, University of Tromsø and Norwegian Psychiatric Association's Board of Transcultural Psychiatry & Global Mental Health. The need of development of highly educated mental health professionals has been emphasized bythe government and experts of Nepal. Similarly, in Norway, there is a growing need to include crosscultural aspects in training of mental health professionals due to an increasing diverse populations belonging to different cultures. The collaboration between these Universities and their supporting partners will create an excellent opportunity to promote mobility of 51 students (master & PhD) along with visit by academic personnel in both directions. In addition, organizing international seminars, guest lectures and courses, curriculum reviews of master programs, writing up of a new PhD curriculum in Nepal, developing common research projects and common supervision of master and PhD students in both countries will be the part of the program. Amending two decades old Master curriculum and starting a PhD program at IOM. TU will be an important outcome and a breakthrough in mental health education in Nepal. Women, underprivileged and indigenous populations will be given higher preference in the project in both countries. Norwegian students and staffs will also get a unique opportunity to learn from a resource-poor country and be able to establish some common research projects. The project has been structured to be sustainable for the future.

Project summary and results

Summary: Collaboration in Mental Health (COMENTH) is a NORPART project between Norway and Nepal hosted by the University of Oslo with Tribhuyan University (TU) as our major partner in Nepal and supported by the University of Bergen (UiB), University of Tromsø (UiT), Norwegian Psychiatric Association (NPA), Oso University Hospital (OUH), Kanti Children Hospital (KCH), Child Workers In Nepal (CWIN) and For Utvikling (FORUT). This project aims to enhance the quality of higher education and research in Norway and Nepal in mental health through partnership and collaboration that covers three different disciplines: adult psychiatry, clinical psychology and child and adolescent psychiatry. The project has planned mobility of over 50 students (master & PhD), several academic and administrative personnel including high-level officers in both directions. In addition, organizing common international seminars. quest lectures and courses, curriculum reviews of master programs, writing up a new PhD curriculum in Nepal, developing common research projects and common supervision of master and PhD students in both countries are the major activities of this collaboration. Amending two-decades-old Master curriculum and starting a PhD program at IOM, TU will be important milestones and breakthroughs in mental health education in Nepal. Women, underprivileged and indigenous populations will be given higher preference in the project in both countries. Norwegian students and staff will also get a unique opportunity to learn from a resource-poor country and be able to establish some common research projects with Nepal.

Results: High-level visit by the Vice-chancellor of the TU and the Dean, Campus chief and the Head of Department of Psychiatry and Mental Health. IOM, TU took place in June 2019 with several fruitful meetings and seminars in Oslo. The curriculum of master program in psychiatry and psychology have been reviewed and revised in 2019-2020 and they are in the process of being amended by IOM, TU.Two permanent staff (assistant professors) from IOM, TU are pursuing PhD at UiO while they live in Nepal and work at IOM, TU. Similarly, one psychologist working at KCH has started her PhD at UiT in 2021. Our project was given two years' scholarship for a full-time master student at UiO and she has started from autumn 2021. Despite the pandemic, the majority of the project activities have still taken place as planned except for the physical mobilities of staff and students during 2020-2021. Some of the physical mobilities were either replaced with digital/virtual mobility or postponed to upcoming vears. Participation in joint courses and supervision through digital platforms has helped us to mitigate most of the challenges during the pandemic. This has also given us an opportunity to include even more students in the common courses and also for a longer period than that of the earlier plans. UiB has developed a course in global mental health that gives 30 ECT - i.e. a full semester (originally planned 10 ECT) and this online course was attended by 8 students in 2020 and 4 students in 2021 from Nepal (original plan 2 students). Towards the end of 2021, 7 master students from UiB (4 from this project and 3 from another NORPART project) and 1 from UiO visited IOM TU and other collaborating partners in Nepal (original plan 2-3 students). PhD student mobility from Norway to Nepal was also partially carried out in 2020 and 2021. With regards to the mobility of PhD students from Nepal to Norway, all the 3 PhD students at IOM, TU and KCH who should have been in Norway for their PhD courses, have attended online courses and collected almost 30 credits during the pandemic. Two additional PhD students (1 at UiO, 1 at UiT) who started PhD before 2019 but are being jointly supervised by us affiliated to TU, KCH, UiO, UiT are going to complete their PhD this year. All these PhD students (5 in total) will be good resources to start PhD at IOM, TU. This will be a major breakthrough and an important milestone in higher education in mental health in Nepal. Total number of students exchanged until 2021 is 29 (11 physical and 18 digital/virtual) while 17 staff have also been exchanged. Moreover, we have been granted an extension of the project to 2024 so that we can have some of the postponed activities/mobilities during the last year. Eventually, the total number of students visiting Norway and Nepal (physical and digital) seems to be higher than originally planned if things go according to the revised plans. Moreover, our collaborating partners FORUT, CWIN and KCH have been granted 10 million kroner by NORAD for 2022 to expand the child & adolescent psychiatry and mental health (CAPMH) services at KCH and CWIN, including telemedicine. This will have a synergistic effect on our project. Similarly, TU and UiO have jointly applied for research grants to the Research Council of Norway for 12 million kroner with the possibility of several PhD and postdoc positions at TU and UiO.

2.2 Project implementation

Work plan for the project (from the previous annual report)

We have slightly revised the work plans for 2021 and the upcoming years. We are also hereby applying for an extension of our project to 2024.

2021 activities: with some remarks

- 3rd APM in Kathmandu: Partly organized on 19th January 2021 in zoom. We are planning a physical meeting in October/November in Kathmandu.
- Continuation of PhD forum for all the PhD candidates in Nepal and Norway:
- 2nd meeting for the development of PhD program and finalization: hybrid solution- through physical and zoom meetings
- 2 PhD students from Norway to Nepal for 1 & 3 months: We will try to recruit even though the pandemic is still a challenge

- Mobility of the 1st and 2nd PhD candidate from Nepal to Norway: Both the students are currently attending some online courses at UiO and are regularly being supervised by Professors from Norway via zoom. They may visit UiO if they are allowed and need to attend courses at UiO physically.
- Mobility of 8 Master students from Nepal to Norway as explained above under 2020: As explained below under this activity, it will not be possible to carry out this activity in 2021. This will thus be replaced by digital teaching and supervision. We are also applying for an extension of the project to 2024 where this will be a major part of the project activity.
- Mobility of 3 Master students (psychology) from Norway (UiB) to Nepal for 2 months: It may be possible by the end of the year if the pandemic gets under control. Alternative plan- to attend the joint course in global mental health.
- Mobility of 3 Master students (medicine or int. health) for 2 months from Norway (UiO) to Nepal (TU): Will be tried in the fall semester despite the ongoing pandemic. Alternatively, two-three medical /master students will be supervised jointly by teachers at UiO and IOM, TU.
- Int./ joint course/conference in Kathmandu: We are planning to organize this in October/November 2021 I. An alternative plan is to organize a series of webinars as of 2020.
- 1st PhD candidate submits PhD thesis at UiO: May be postponed to 2022
- Mobility of 1 PhD student from KCH to UiT. (Ms. Srijana Adhikari is following online courses in the spring semester. If she is allowed to travel, she will be visiting Tromsø later this year for a shorter period.

Project progress and deviations 2021

COVID-19 pandemic continued to affect our project plans in 2021, however, we were better prepared than in 2020. Some of the initially planned mobilities were either postponed to future years or replaced by digital mobilities. With a better IT infrastructure at our collaborating institution, we used online solutions for some of the activities as described below. **Significant deviations are written in italics.**

- 1. 3rd APM in Kathmandu: As mentioned in our annual report for 2020, we organized a digital annual meeting (part 1) on 19th January 2021 by using zoom with representations from all the participating institutions. Although we planned an additional physical annual meeting (part 2) in October/November 2021 in Kathmandu, that could not materialize due to the pandemic. Earlier also we have had this meeting once a year, in January /February.
- 2. Continuation of PhD forum for all the PhD candidates in Nepal and Norway: This has been organized regularly with some adjustments. In addition, all the PhD students at IOM TU participate in regular research meetings of the research group- Traumatic stress, forced migration and global mental health which is coordinated by the COMENTH-NORPART project leader. This group has over 15 members and this has given a broader opportunity for PhD candidates and established researchers in Norway and Nepal. This new activity will just continue.
- 3. 2nd meeting for the development of PhD program and finalization: The project coordinator visited IOM in October 2021 and had a series of meetings with the dean's office, the Department of Psychiatry, and other stakeholders. A PhD forum meeting was also organized in Kathmandu to discuss on start of PhD. A follow-up visit to finalize PhD course contents and organize a larger workshop with the relevant stakeholders was planned from 3rd to 18th December which had to be canceled at the last moment with the insurgence of the Omicron virus in Norway and Nepal. However, a digital meeting was held in late December where we discussed a bit more about it. We agreed that we need some more time to make course content for a PhD program. We have also realized that UiO should help in the starting years for courses and supervision.
- 4. 2 PhD students from Norway to Nepal for 1 & 3 months: A PhD student at UiO got 3 months stipend and used this period to finalize his PhD thesis through common supervision between TU and UiO. He has already submitted his PhD thesis to UiO in January 2022. *However, we could not send another PhD student for 1 month this year.*
- 5. Mobility of the 1st and 2nd PhD candidate from Nepal to Norway: *They could not travel to Norway due to the pandemic*. Sagun Pant and Saraswati Dhungana attended PhD courses that were run online by the Medical Faculty of University of Oslo. They were regularly supervised by Professors from Norway via zoom and emails and their progress is as good as it should have been.
- 6.Mobility of 8 Master students from Nepal to Norway as explained above under 2020: As explained and indicated in our annual report for 2020, we have partly replaced this year's mobility with digital teaching and supervision and partly applied for an extension in 2024.

- 7. Mobility of 3 Master students (psychology) from Norway (UiB) to Nepal for 2 months: *UiB sent 7 master students to Nepal*, 4 of them were from our NORPART project while the other 3 were master students selected for another NORPART project in Vietnam. Since UiB could not send 3 students to Vietnam, our project was asked to accommodate an additional 3 students. In a very short notice, IOM, TU and Kanti hospital were ready to receive and place 7 students. *Their stay in Kathmandu got however shortened by one week again due to the Omnicorn pandemic.*
- 8. Mobility of 3 Master students (medicine or int. health) for 2 months from Norway (UiO) to Nepal (TU): One Master student from UiO went to Nepal and was at IOM for a month, Her stay was also cut down again due to the increasing cases of COVID in Kathmandu. She has been a key person in developing a common research project between TUTH, IOM and UiO together with Karolinska Institutet and the University of Copenhagen. An application for funding has been sent to the Research Council of Norway on Feb 1, 2022. We had also two medical students ready to go to Nepal and be involved in a common research project between TU and UiO in early 2021. However, they could not travel for the same reason i.e. pandemic. They have still managed to write a master thesis from the common research project with common supervision.
- 9. Int./ joint course/conference in Kathmandu: This got canceled due to the same reason-ongoing pandemic.
- 10. 1st PhD candidate submits PhD thesis at UiO: As indicated earlier, this has been postponed to 2022. The candidate started her PhD in late 2019 and her progress has been affected by the pandemic.
- 11. Mobility of 1 PhD student from KCH to UiT: Ms. Srijana Adhikari has participated in online PhD courses at UiT and she has also received a digital supervision from her supervisors. Jasmine Ma has also been supervised by UiT and she will submit her thesis within 2022.
- 12. "Development of curriculum for 2-year fellowship education in child & adolescent psychiatry at UCAP KCH": KCH is working on it in collaboration with FORUT.

Risk assessment

COVID-19 pandemic which badly affected and almost paralyzed the whole world in 2020-21 has also affected our project and collaboration. However, the very recent developments regarding the pandemic are quite positive and have given us better hope in the upcoming years. Since we were better prepared in 2021 than in 2020, we have been able to replace most of the physical mobilities with digital mobilities and have also had some physical mobilities towards the end of 2021. It was also of great help that we were allowed to use some of the allocated funds to build infrastructure at TU and KCH that has enabled us to mitigate most of the challenges during the pandemic. Another challenge with a loss of 1 academic year/batch at IOM, TU (Psychiatry & Psychology) due to the pandemic has also hindered our plans for mobilities of master students especially in psychiatry. Since all the Universities in Norway offered digital teaching for master and PhD students, that have still made us achieve most of our goals. However, it is too early to predict how the COVID pandemic will be in near future and upcoming years.

General comments: Due to the pandemic, most of the physical mobilities and meetings could not take place as planned. Many of them were however replaced by digital meetings and digital courses. This is the major reason behind the significantly reduced use (530 028 NOK of the budgeted 1 125 105 NOK) in 2021. Although we have been informed that we could use up to 40% of the allocated budget for salaries and indirect costs like in 2020, we chose not to do so, but we would rather allocate the unused amount on educational activities and mobilities of students in the upcoming years including the extended year -2024 which we think is much more important.

This could not be used due to the pandemic and has been transferred to 2022.
