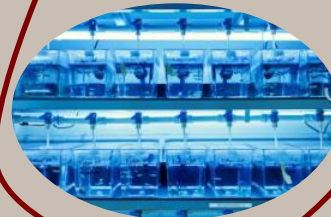

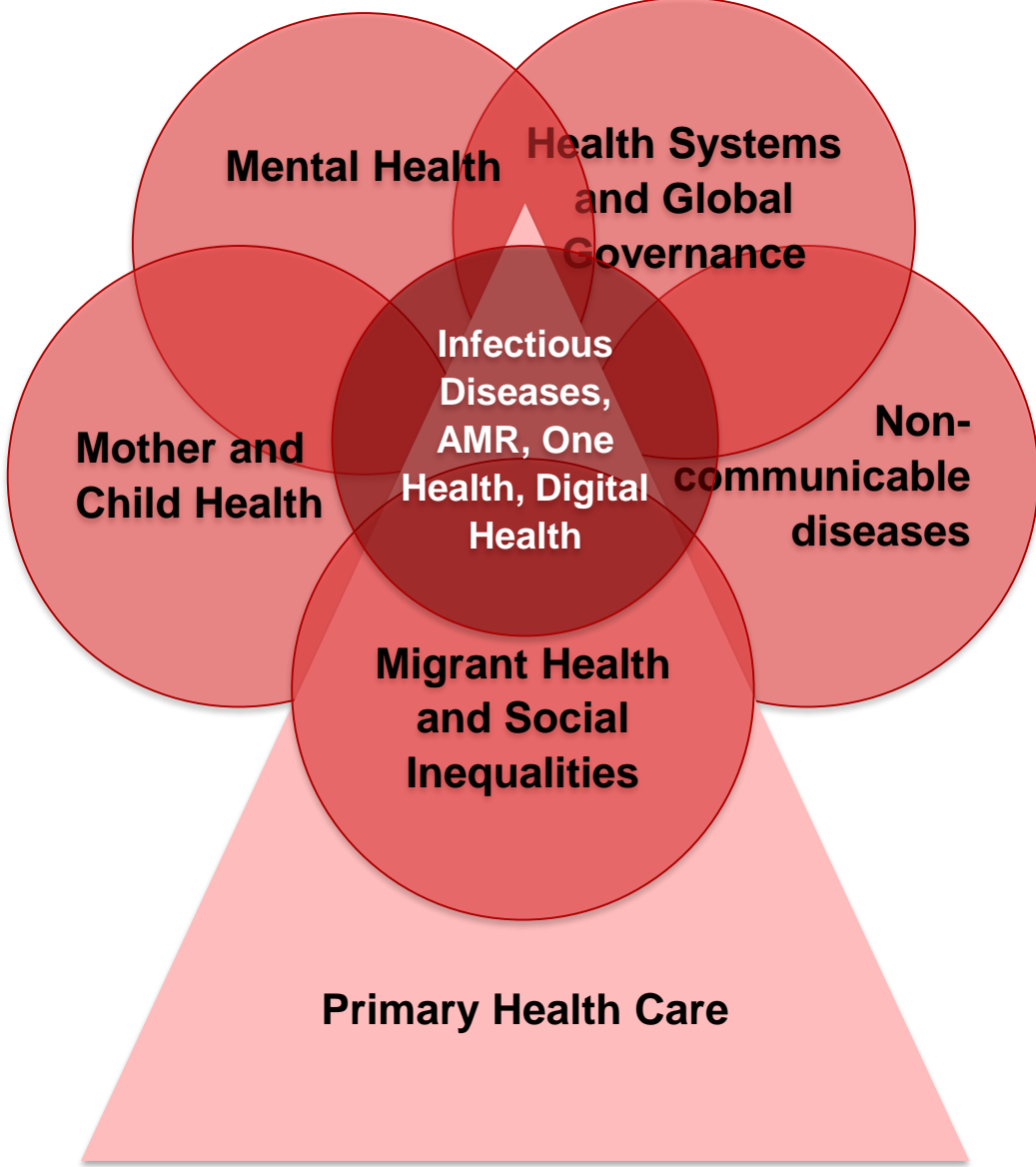


Figure: Four priority areas for seed funding within CGH signatory themes

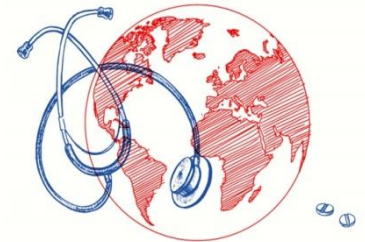
Objective D

- **Objective D:** facilitate Global Health activities through an active and professional communication platform (webpages, social media, dissemination) with especial emphasis on objective A-C above;
- **Objective E:** organize and coordinate the elective Global Health courses within the Faculty of Medicine PhD programme;
- **Objective F:** facilitate for the organization and execution of The Lancet commission on One-Health and the article series in the Scandinavian Journal of Public Health.
