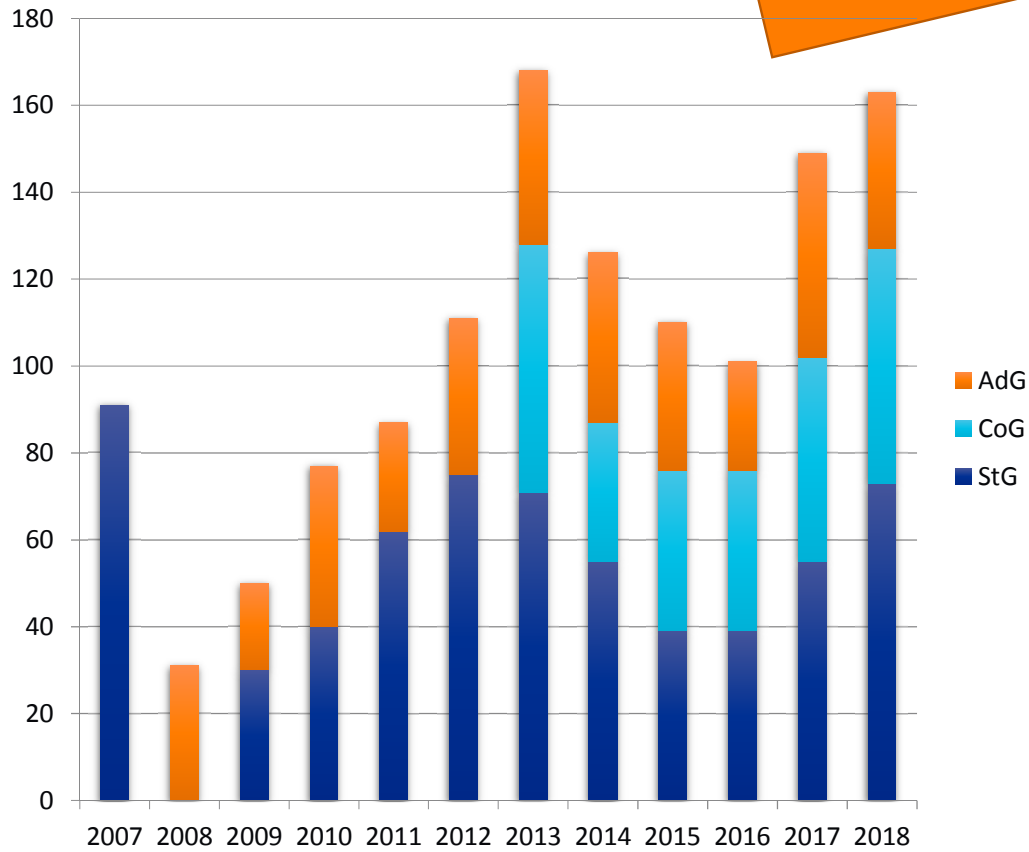


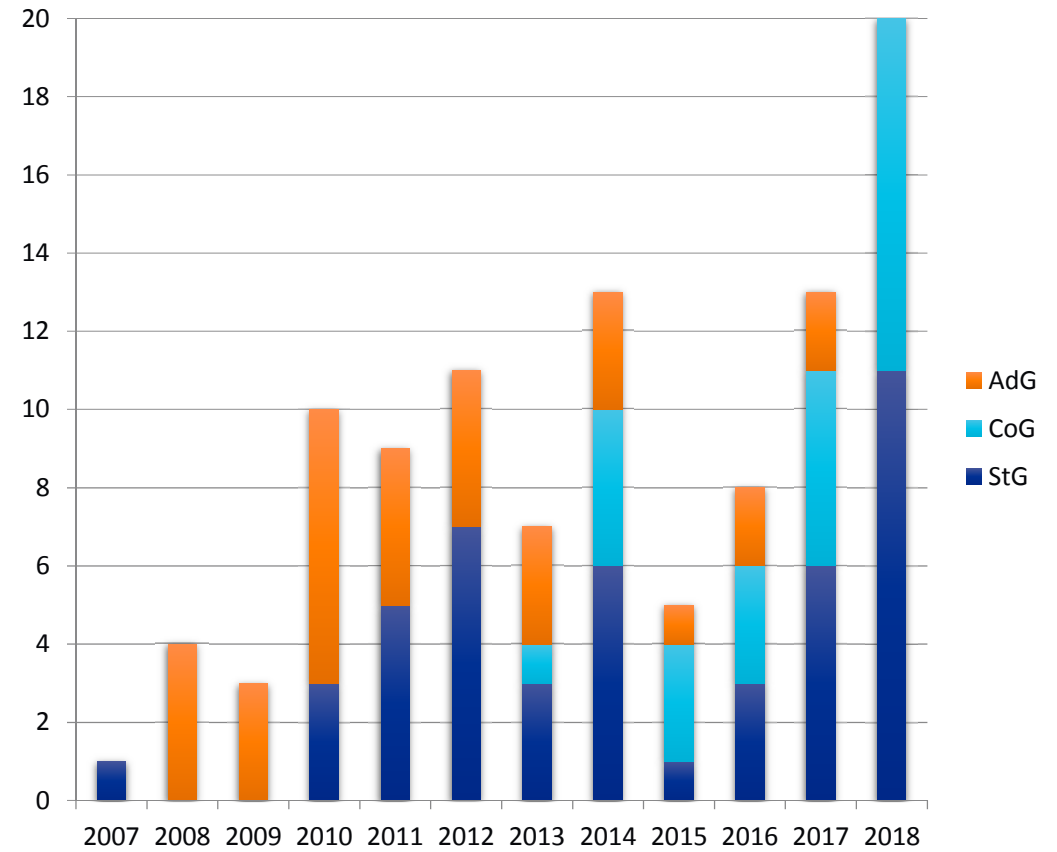

Overall findings in the survey

- Many Norwegian researchers are well-suited to ERC application
- ERC grants enjoy a high profile and prestige, a majority of the respondents considers applying (again)
- Previous grant experience offers good preparation and 'pipelines' to ERC application
- A lot of variation in the kind of support the ERC applicants have received

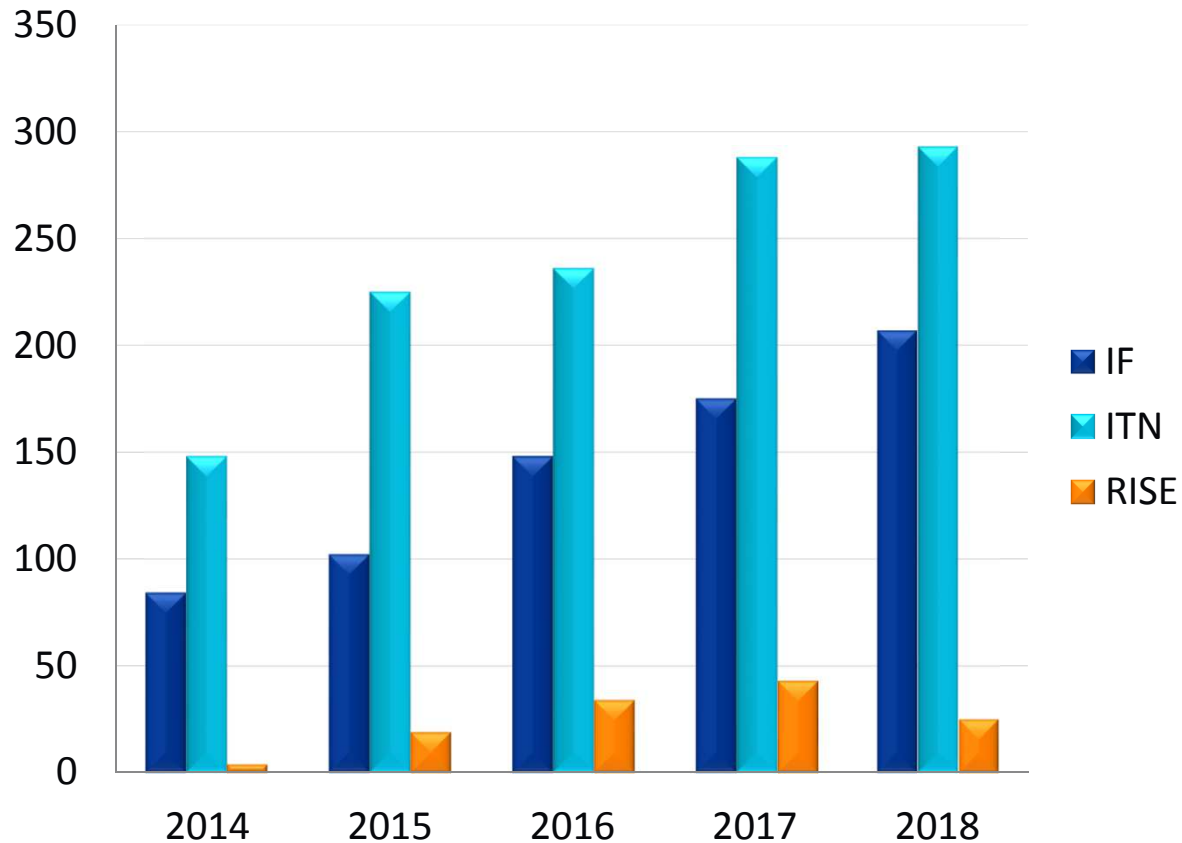
Other findings for follow-up

- Mis-match between national and institutional strategies and the ability of individual departments or faculties to target and support specific ERC applicants
- Many researchers struggle to self-assess whether they are the right 'fit' and at the right career stage to apply
- More support from peers is wanted
- Many non-applicants are not aware of the support available
- Focus on multiple application. 2/3 have applied only once
 - Only 6% succeed the first time
 - Success rate doubles from the second application


Acknowledge that first time ERC application is as much about capacity building and familiarisation as it is about success

Marie Skłodowska-Curie actions

- Increase in number of successful Norwegian applications until 2017
- 2018 results not so good, but some projects on reserve lists
- The increase in IF is due to “Master classes” at the institutions 
- A very high percentage of the ITN-applications are resubmitted
