Assessment guidelines

HELSEF4410 Introduction to Qualitative Methods

Autumn 2020 – Home exam

The purpose of the course is to introduce **students to** basic concepts and approaches in qualitative methodology. Upon completion of the course, students will be able to develop a qualitative research design and critically reflect on strengths and limitations of qualitative research designs. Students will learn to identify and reflect upon ethical challenges in qualitative research.

The exam consist of two parts

Part I

500-1000 words

- 1. Propose a research aim/objective and formulate a relevant research question related to your chosen text suitable for qualitative inquiry
- 2. Develop a qualitative study design to achieve this aim including the following:
 - Data collection techniques and why these are suitable
 - Sampling and participant recruitment strategy
 - Ethical consideration in the research process in your study

Part II

500-1000 words

Imagine you are presenting your research design chosen in part I to an interdisciplinary panel.

Discuss and defend the scientific value of qualitative research in general and reflect upon possible strategies to improve the validity/trustworthiness in your particular research design in Part I.

In the assessment of the exam, emphasis should be placed on whether

- The research question, research design, data collection techniques as well as sampling and participant recruitment strategies and ethical considerations in part I are justified, clearly formulated and relevant to the chosen text
- Discussions and reflections in part II show familiarity with epistemological premises and current principles in qualitative methods
- The language complies with standards of academic writing and the use of references is in accordance with academic standards
